Here is the challenge which Dr. Schumacher has left for us to meet. It is our task to work out concrete and dynamic proposals for our social, political and economic organizations so that we can create a revolution not only in consciousness, which is of course fundamental, but in structures as well.

One danger we face in this world of specialization is that we tend to take only one aspect or one dimension of reality and think of it as total reality. Like those blind men who met a certain animal and each of whom touched a different part of its body - legs, ears, trunk, tail and so on. When they gathered together to describe the animal, they all had totally different ideas of what the animal looked like. The one who had touched the leg thought it was like a pillar. The one who touched the tail thought of it as a thin hanging rope. The one who had touched the trunk thought of it as a fat crusty worm. In this way all of them kept arguing and quarreling with each other without knowing the whole animal — the total elephant.
